The gallery **Glenda Cinquegrana: the Studio** is pleased to announce the participation of the artist **David Goldenberg** to **PERSONAL STRUCTURES**, exhibition included in the collateral events of the **55th International Art Exhibition Ia Biennale di Venezia**, which will take place in the wonderful Venetian location of Palazzo Bembo, on Grand Canal, curated by Francesca Crudo, Sarah Gold, Carol Rolla, Valeria Romagnini for **Global Art Affairs Foundation**.

The exhibition **PERSONAL STRUCTURES** included in collateral events of **55th International Art Exhibition Ia Biennale di Venezia** brings together an extraordinary combination of established artists next to artists whose oeuvre is less known. Coming from different parts of the world and using different media, what they have in common is a dedication to the concepts of *Time, Space and Existence*. The exhibition features a broad variety of artistic media, such as: videos, sculptures, paintings, photos, light installations, wallpaper and performance, where each artist in the exhibition presents recent artworks, either site-specific, especially made for this exhibition, or coming directly from the artist's studio.

For this exposition, **David Goldenberg** presents us with a site-specific project titled **The Transformation of Art**, the ideal outcome of his recent research into the development of *Post Autonomy* space as a privileged venue for the renovation of artistic and cultural language.

Goldenberg's research sets out from the proposition that the structure of contemporary artistic production, as part of a Eurocentric artistic tradition, is suffering from a profound crisis, both financial and cultural. Goldenberg, who has repeatedly denounced this *status quo*, maintains that it manifests itself particularly as a crisis of language. Following an extended conceptual reflection which resulted in the '*continuous inhabiting of the Post Autonomy Space'*, the ideal venue for free and autonomous research, the artist now suggests a number of solutions for its renewal: in *Participating Cultures*, which are '*involved in creating new concepts for their cultures, which are linked neither to the past nor to Western Modernism, but to concepts which are as yet unknown'*.

The *Participating Cultures* are present in the creative space of the exhibition by means of a participatory practice expressed in a program of online debates and activities which, through the production of mental maps, textual works and diagrams, seeks to trace a way out of the current state of impasse and disorientation. The map is the primary symbol of this attempt at reform which, by stepping outside of the cultural model of the Biennial, finds in the reciprocal relationship between European and non-European cultures the basic elements for reinventing cultural structures and reformulating the goals and objectives of Contemporary Art as such.

Artist's biography

David Goldenberg (Hitchin, Hertfordshire, UK, 1956) is an important English conceptual artist.

For years, his research has been concentrated on the *Post Autonomy* concept, which he has developed in a number of shows held at important international institutions, standouts amongst which are the recent Italian show at Glenda Cinquegrana: the Studio of Milan, *The Scenarios of Post Autonomy* in September 2012, followed by the performance *In search of Post Autonomy*, staged at Palazzo Isimbardi with the patronage of Provincia di Milano. To those shows we can add *Template - Mobile Documenta*, Chisenhale Studios, London (2011), *The Space of Post Autonomy*, Arts Depot, Vienna (2011), *Plausible Artworlds*, Basekamp, Philadelphia (2010), *Mobile Documenta*, Fordham Gallery, London (2009), *The Time of Post Autonomy is Now*, Your Space, Van Abbemuseum, Eindhoven, The Netherlands (2009), *The Space of Post Autonomy*, Local Operations, Serpentine Gallery, London (2007).

Goldenberg has participated in a number of collective shows of international stature, standouts amongst which are the Berlin Biennal (2012), the First Mongolian Biennial (2010), tenth Istanbul Biennial (2007), and the Sixth Sharjah Biennial, United Arab Emirates (2003). To these must be added the exhibitions at international public institutions, such as *Jump Into Cold Water*, Shedhalle, Zurich (2006), *Century City*, Tate Modern, London (2001), *Out of Space*, Kolnischerkustverein, Germany (2000).

The Post Autonomy Group is made of the following artists:

Ozlem Kalmaz (born in Izmir, Turkey, 1980) an artist based in Izmir, Turkey.

Bahram Khalilov (born in Baku, Azerbaijan, 1970) chairman of the United Artists Club (BRK), collaborator of the Caspian Sea Biennial, graphic designer of the Arts magazine (İncəsənət) and creative director for the Centre for Contemporary Art (MiM) in Baku.

Helen Kirwan (born in Dublin, Ireland, 1949), English based lecturer and artist with an understanding and research into Post Autonomy. She has led a partial research into methodologies related to materialist practices, including institutional critique and participatory practices, which are appropriate for this project.

Kate Kotcheff (born in London, 1965). Canadian born English based filmmaker and artist, Kate has taken responsibility for producing an in-depth documentary on the Venice Biennale project.

Andrea Lind-Valdan (born in Copenaghen, Denmark, 1985) is a Danish artist who has collaborated with the group on previous occasions, particularly in the online performance in Milan (*In Search of Post Autonomy*, Palazzo Isimbardi, November 2012).

Ioana Pioaru (born in Pucioasa, Romania, 1986) is a Romanian artist and designer. She has experienced working on the *Post Autonomy* project for a year and a half, having the opportunity to design, edit and produce four publications. She also assisted on the show in Milan (*The Scenarios of Post Autonomy*, Glenda Cinquegrana: the Studio, 2012); then collaborated on the performance in Milan (*In Search of Post Autonomy*, Palazzo Isimbardi, November 2012). She played an integral role in the production of the Venice Biennale project.

Wim Salki (born in Kerkade, The Netherlands, 1960) is a Dutch based artist with considerable in-depth understanding of installation art and participatory practices, the concept of Post Autonomy, multiculturalism. He works with photography and multi-media. He has worked at the highest levels including Manifesta and Sharjah Biennial. His research and long term investigations into the effects of neo-liberalism are particularly significant for the Venice Biennale project.

The exhibition **PERSONAL STRUCTURES** is part of an international art project. It was initiated in 2002 by the Dutch artist Rene Rietmeyer, who noticed that even in the most distant corners of the world, there are artists working with Time, Space and Existence, thereby expressing themselves in a very personal way. This observation led to the idea of bringing several of these artists together in publications, exhibitions and symposia.
